

BH Updates: Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) NDC Codes and New ICD-10 Diagnoses

MEDICATION ASSISTED TREATMENT (MAT) NDC CODES

Ohio Department of Medicaid (ODM) has received recent requests to update providers on how J-codes are to be billed with the appropriate NDC codes. This communication is intended to respond to those requests.

Listed below are the codes that can be claimed for Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) as well as the NDC requirements for each code:

No NDC Required

- H0020 – Methadone administration
- T1502 – Buprenorphine/Naloxone office administration

An NDC is Required

- J8499 – Oral Naltrexone
- S5000 – Buprenorphine/naloxone generic
- S5000 HD – Buprenorphine generic
- S5001 – Buprenorphine/Naloxone Brand

A Specifically Paired NDC is Required

- J0571 – Buprenorphine, 1 mg
- J0572 – Buprenorphine/naloxone < or = 3 mg
- J0573 – Buprenorphine/naloxone > 3 but < 6 mg
- J0574 – Buprenorphine/naloxone > 6 but < 10 mg
- J0575 – Buprenorphine/naloxone > 10 mg

ODM, in cooperation with the managed care plans, has developed guidance for what NDC codes correspond to what J-codes. Given the changes that occur with NDC codes, ODM will update this list on a quarterly basis. The next update will be available January 1, 2019, and then the beginning of each subsequent quarter.

NEW ICD-10 DIAGNOSES
